"Hypoglycemia"

In my two previous article, I discussed diabetes, and hyperglycemia.

Hypoglycemia is the opposite of hyperglycemia, in that one's blood sugar, (glucose), level goes lower than normal.

One main causes of hypoglycemia is diabetes, and is a result of complications of such.

Some people have this without diseases, and for no apparent reason. Sometimes, from not eating soon enough.

Signs and symptoms are:

- a hot & uncomfortable feeling
- sweating
- shaking
- paleness
- dizziness
- weakness
- irritability
- uncooperative, w/out knowing why, and might be mistaken for drunkenness
- convulsions
- unconsciousness
- death, as a last result, may occur, at a very low blood sugar level.

Treatment includes:

- glucose tabs or candy
- eating a meal

If one becomes unconscious, do not try to give anything by mouth. A glucagon pen, injectable, can be used.

At the hospital, ER staff will start an IV, and give glucose. Many times, a person will wake up before the medication is even completed.

Insulin dosages may need to be adjusted.

For those not attending Comic-Con, *The Captains* makes its world premiere on July 22 at 8:00 P.M. EDT on EPIX and EpixHD.com. The showing will be part of "Shatnerpalooza," which will also include *William Shatner's Gonzo Ballet*, the first six *Star Trek* movies and various movies and television show guest appearances featuring Shatner.



EPIX announced that a preview of *The Captains* would be shown at Comic-Con on Friday, July 22.
